### TASC Committee Chair Passes the Torch

In recent times, Judge Paul White served as Chair to the TASC Legislative Committee. In his role, he recruited several members to join him in watching relevant legislation that could impact Texas specialty courts. He shined a light on legislation that TASC members should be aware of and discussed TASC's position on the matter with the board. Along with the committee co-chairs, Judge Larry Phillips and Julie Turnbull, he worked diligently to oversee this project. The board recognized the importance of the Committee's work and voted to create a new role, Legislative Director, to ensure this work continues to expand.

On April 19th, Judge White handed the reigns over to Judge Aurora Martinez Jones of Travis County, as the newly elected Legislative Director, whom he believed to be "imminently qualified" for the new role and "passionate with a vision to advance the interests of TASC."

Before retiring, Judge White left the latest review of legislative proposals relevant to specialty courts and sent a message to the committee thanking everyone for serving. The Board is grateful for his service to TASC and wish him well on his future endeavors. He will be missed.

### **DIVERT Court Celebrates 25 Years!**

On May 16, 2023, the Dallas Initiative for Expedited Recovery and Treatment (DIVERT) Court team, led by The Honorable Hector Garza, held their 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration along with their most recent graduation. In attendance were a number of local dignitaries, and TASC was on hand to present the team with the 2023 Judge Ruben G. Reyes Outstanding Specialty Court Team award. The Honorable John Creuzot gave a brief history of the program he started, a DIVERT alumnus told her very poignant story of recovery, Judge Garza announced a generous donation from the family of a prior DIVERT graduate, and one of the participants who was graduating that night announced during his speech that he was matching the donation in order to assist future participants with recovery needs. It was an inspirational celebration and would have made Judge Reyes very proud. Congratulations to the DIVERT Court team members, stakeholders, and participants!

### District Attorney's Office Sponsors Specialized Training

DCDAO sponsored HEAT and HER Training May 8-12, 2023. The West Dallas Multipurpose Center welcomed 25 counselors and probation officers from IPS (Dallas), Tarrant County CSCD, Women in Recovery Family & Children's Services (Tulsa, OK), Nexus Recovery Center (Dallas), and Dallas County CSCD. The training included five full days of learning and facilitating the HEAT and HER Treatment Program Modalities supported by the National Association of

Drug Court Professionals (NADCP). Counselors and probation officers learned gender specific interventions effective for disenfranchised minority populations involved in the criminal justice system. Such treatment models will provide culturally responsive treatment to specialty court diversion programs in Dallas County.
